Questions you might see on the Final.

1. Find phonetic properties (see midterm). You will be provided with the IPA chart on the final.
2. Vocabulary: matching (see midterm)
3. Identify different alphabet types.
4. Identify roots, plus whether it is formed off of the past/present participle, or root (see midterm).
5. Given Latin or Greek structures, prefix(es) + root + various morphological pieces + suffixes, derive the English word or a nonsense word (see midterm). ex. $\mathbf{e x}+\operatorname{lig}+\mathrm{e}+\mathrm{t} \quad$ answer: elicit
6. Given an English word of Latin origin, come up the underlying structure by breaking it down into its morphological pieces (see Assignment \#2).
Example: convenient $=$ con + ven $+i\left(\right.$ long ${ }^{\prime} \mathbf{i}$ ') $+\mathrm{e}+\mathrm{nt}$.
7. Given a French word, identify the process that has occurred.
8. Short answer (see Midterm).
9. Multiple choice: given a word, have to indicate which rules apply (see Assignment \#2).
10. Germanic Consonant Shift (see Assignment \#1 and Midterm)
