
"**Poua**, kei te tangi ngā manu tītī i tēnei pō."

"Āe. Kei te rere ngā manu tītī, e Tame."


"Nā te aha i pērā ai, **Poua**?"

“He tohu ēnei, he rā pai āpōpō mō te hī ika.”




“E Tame, **ko tere kō** tō haere ki te

Titiro **Poua**, kua tau mai tētehi **hopo** ki runga i te tauranga ika.


He tohu tērā. Me hoki tāua ki te kāinga i nāia tata nei.
